¹Pecuniary Legacy (a specified amount)

'I give the sum of £_____ (in words and numbers) to Petals charity of Unit 1, Tunbridge Court, Tunbridge Lane, Bottisham, Cambridge CB25 9TU, Registered Charity No. 1150375, and I declare that the receipt of the treasurer or any other proper authorized officer shall be a full and sufficient discharge to my executors.'

²A gift of residue (a percentage)

I give to Petals (Registered Charity No. 1150375) (write 'all' or the share you would like to leave to Petals) and I direct that the receipt of the treasurer or any other proper authorized officer shall be a full and sufficient discharge to my executors .

Glossary of Terms:

1. Pecuniary Legacy

If you want to leave an exact amount of money to a person or organisation this is known as a **Pecuniary Legacy**. A Pecuniary Legacy can often be used as a gift to charity. Pecuniary Legacies have priority over an estate and will be paid out before any balance is distributed.

2. Residuary Legacy

Once all debts, Specific Legacies and Pecuniary Legacies have been paid out, the balance of an estate is known as the **residue**. A Residuary beneficiary will receive a proportion of your estate and this can be divided up between any number of beneficiaries in various proportions (e.g. 50% of residue will be donated to charity).
